A Pivotal Time

"As a senior in undergrad, I considered many different post-graduate options [and] recognized that my first year after graduation was a pivotal time that would set the tone for my future."

Margaret Hodson, a graduate of Georgetown University and soon to begin working at Deloitte as a Government and Public Sector consultant, recently shared with us her reflections on Orthodoxy and Service. "I wanted to choose an opportunity that would serve as a solid foundation and instill lifelong values and habits. I was looking for a program that would help me discern my vocation through the lens of my faith." Since "there was no Orthodox year-of-service program, I decided instead to join the Jesuit Volunteer Corps (JVC)."

While JVC was a valuable experience, it did not "fully minister to my needs as an Orthodox Christian." Margaret had to be proactive in getting time off for Liturgy & Orthodox Easter and in finding Orthodox mentors. She longed to "share my year-of-service experience with other Orthodox young adults."

We agree with Margaret. Orthodox young adults face a pivotal time. They deserve an Orthodox program dedicated to service and formation. That's why we're launching Orthodox Volunteer Corps. Thanks for being on the journey with us!

Updates since our last newsletter!

We received our tax-exempt approval from the IRS. We can now accept direct donations through Paypal, Zelle, or check. A huge thanks to the Assembly of Bishops for serving as our fiscal agent for those first months.

Fundraising is going well:

- We have raised over \$95,000 in cash & commitments from individuals & parishes!
- We got our first grant for \$15,000.
 We're grateful to the AHEPA
 National Housing Incorporation for their generous support.
- We recently applied for a grant from the Renaissance Fund, have meetings lined up with other
 Orthodox Foundations, and have held several meetings with a program officer at the Lilly
 Endowment with the goal of submitting a proposal this summer or fall.

Thanks to numerous conversations with our board, donors, foundations, and other supporters, we have developed an expanded strategy to broaden our impact.

- Our Core Program, which we have shared with you all, remains the same: full-time, 10months and rooted in the four OVC pillars of Service, Formation, Community, and Church. We will have 6-8 participants in each city we target.
- Now we have added a new element: The Roundtable Program will be for young adults who are working or in school full time, but still want to engage with OVC. Roundtable Members (25-30 in each target city) will experience the same four-pillar curriculum but on a part-time basis and not live in communal housing.
- Finally, we will integrate the two programs, capitalizing on the unique strengths of each.
 One city at a time, we intend to develop a critical mass of Orthodox young adults to launch innovative, faith-imbued, sustainable projects that integrate service, church, and community.

What's next? Here's what we're planning for the fall:

- Public Launch of OVC. We've been meeting individually with lots of partners; soon we want to host an event that shares this ministry with the larger community. Stay tuned.
- National campaign to recruit the best and brightest Orthodox young adults to join the full-time Core Program (first cohort to begin fall 2022).
- Build a deep and wide network with parishes and community members in Pittsburgh, where we will pilot both the Core and Roundtable programs.
- Collaborate with other Orthodox organizations to create service & formative opportunities for young adults, beginning this fall.
